# Grade Level: K-2

### **Objectives**:

- 1. Students will be able to sing this song without aid of the teacher..
- 2. Students will be able to sing this song on solfege.
- 3. Students will be able to use the Curwen hand signs with this song.

## Materials:

- Hackett, P., & Lindeman, C. (2007). *The Musical Classroom: Backgrounds, Models and Skills for Elementary Teaching*. Upper Saddle River, NJ: Pearson Prentice Hall
- Sheet music for all students

#### Procedures:

- 1. Pass out song selection to class with rhythm and solfege already written in. Have them count the rhythm with the teacher using Kodaly rhythm notation (ta, ti-ti, etc.) Have students pat their leg to keep the beat.
- 2. Teach students words using the rote method. Use short phrases, longer phrases and then try the whole song.
- 3. Lead class in speaking the solfege syllables phrase by phrase.
- 4. After solfege has been mastered speak solfege while using the Curwen handsigns. Also break this down phrase by phrase.
- 5. Lead class in singing the solfege while using the hand signs, phrase by phrase. Have students repeat without aid of the teacher.
- 6. If time: start teaching students Spanish lyrics.

#### **Evaluation**:

- 1. Were students able to sing this song without aid of the teacher?
- 2. Were students able to sing this song on solfege?
- 3. Were students able to use the Curwen hand signs with this song?
